The information within this guide must be used in conjunction with the information in the Volkswagen Owner's Manual. Refer to your vehicle's Owner's Manual for all information and warnings, and feature limitations. By using this guide, you acknowledge that you are aware of and have read the warnings and information provided in the Owner's Manual on the topics in this guide and will use this information to augment that material. Always pay careful attention to the road and do not drive while distracted. Some infotainment features can only be accessed and operated when the vehicle is standing still. This is not a malfunction, but rather compliance with legal regulations.

1. Driver Information Display

When the ignition is switched on, you can display trip computer information and control a variety of vehicle functions using the multifunction steering wheel.

2. Climate Control

Your vehicle is equipped with a manual climate control system or a Climatronic Climate Control system.

3. Infotainment

Hard keys and touchscreen buttons that control the various infotainment functions, including radio, media selections, phone operation, car functions and the optional Navigation system.

4. Windshield Wiper Stalk

Push down for a brief wipe. Push up one click for intermittent wiping, two clicks for slow continuous wiping and three clicks for faster continuous wiping. Pull lever to activate windshield washers. Switch on top of stalk controls intermittent wiping interval timing.

5. Steering Wheel Left Side Controls

Microphone Button: Activates Bluetooth® Voice Recognition or mutes the radio.

Phone Button: Displays the Phone main menu or accepts and ends phone calls.

Increase or Decrease: Volume settings for radio, navigation system notifications or phone calls.

Arrow Buttons: Can be used to change radio stations, scroll through radio presets, or select the next or previous media track.

6. Steering Wheel Right Side Controls

The buttons on the right side of the multifunction steering wheel are used to access functions in the instrument cluster display:

OK Button: Used to select settings for features in the instrument cluster display.

Menu Buttons: Used to move up and down through the instrument cluster menus.

Up/Down Arrow Buttons: Navigate inside a specific menu.

Back Arrow: Return to previous selection.

Manual Climate Control

Cool the Interior


1. Turn the temperature to **MAX**.
2. Turn the fan speed to **4**.
3. The A/C light will come on automatically. A/C will help to dehumidify the air.
4. Turn the vent dial to the  setting.
5. After reaching the desired temperature, turn the fan speed down to a lower setting.

Heat the Interior

1. Turn the temperature dial all the way to the right.
2. Turn the fan speed to **3**.
3. Turn the vent dial to the  setting.

Defrost the Windshield

1. Turn the temperature dial all the way to the right.
2. Turn the fan speed to **3**.
3. Turn the vent dial to the  setting.
4. The A/C function comes on automatically and it is recommended to leave A/C on to dry the air.

Note: Manual climate control is available on certain trim lines. In the event of significant fogging, cracking a window briefly can help. A/C is used to dehumidify and condition the air.

Warnings: Climate Control

Poor visibility increases the risk of collisions and other accidents that cause serious personal injuries. • Always make sure all windows are clear of ice, snow and condensation for good visibility to the front, sides, and rear. • Maximum heating output and defrosting performance are not possible until the engine has reached operating temperature. Wait until you have good visibility before driving off. • Always make sure you know how to properly use the Climate Control system as well as the rear window defroster that you will need for good visibility. • Never use air recirculation for long periods of time. When the air conditioner is off and recirculation mode is on, condensation can quickly form on the windows and greatly reduce visibility. • Always switch off recirculation mode when it is not needed. • Stale air causes driver fatigue and reduces driver alertness, which can cause accidents, collisions and serious personal injury. • Never switch off the fan for a long period of time and never use air recirculation for a long period of time because no fresh air will enter the passenger compartment. • Always switch off recirculation mode when it is not needed.

Front Seat Controls

Adjust Your Seat Height

- Use the lever on the left side of the seat.
- Pull up to raise the seat and down to lower.

Recline Your Seat

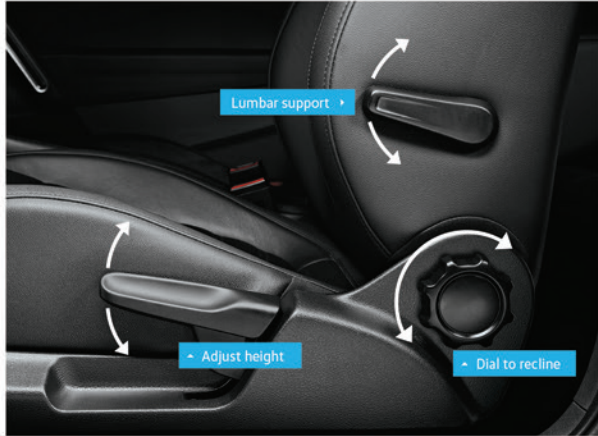
The rotary dial located on the lower rear of your seat provides infinite seatback adjustment. To adjust the seatback:

- Turn the rotary dial on the lower rear of your seat.
- The seatback will move in the same direction you rotate the dial.
- Be sure to lean forward slightly as you rotate the dial; this helps make the adjustment much easier.

Adjust Your Seat Forward or Back

1. Pull up on the handle under the driver's seat.
2. Rock forward or back to a comfortable position.
3. Release the handle to lock the seat in place.

⚠ Warnings: Seat Control

Improper seating positions increase the risk of severe or fatal injuries in a crash or other accidents, especially when the airbag deploys. • All occupants must sit properly and be properly restrained at all times. • Never let more people ride in the vehicle than there are seating positions with safety belts available. • Always secure children in the vehicle with an approved and suitable restraint system appropriate for their age, weight, and height. • Always keep your feet on the floor in front of the seat. Never rest them on the seat, instrument panel, out of the window, etc. The airbag system and safety belt will not be able to protect you properly and can even increase the risk of injury in a crash. • Always adjust seat, safety belts, and head restraints properly before driving and make sure that all passengers are properly restrained. • Push the passenger seat as far back as possible. Always be sure that there are at least 10 inches (25 cm) between the front passenger's breastbone and the instrument panel. • Always adjust the driver's seat and the steering wheel so that there are at least 10 inches (25 cm) between your breastbone and the steering wheel. • Adjust the driver's seat so that you can easily push the pedals all the way to the floor while keeping your knees slightly bent. The distance to the instrument panel in the knee area must be at least 4 inches (10 cm). • If these requirements cannot be met for physical reasons, contact an authorized Volkswagen dealer or an authorized Volkswagen Service Facility to see whether adaptive equipment is available. • Always hold the steering wheel on the outside of the steering wheel rim with your hands at the 9 o'clock and 3 o'clock positions to help reduce the risk of personal injury if the driver's airbag inflates. • Never hold the steering wheel at the 12 o'clock position or with your hands at other places inside the steering wheel rim or on the steering wheel hub. Holding the steering wheel the wrong way can cause serious injuries to the hands, arms, and head if the driver's airbag inflates. • Pointing the steering wheel toward your face decreases the ability of the driver's airbag to help protect you in a collision. • Never drive with backrests reclined or tilted back farther than necessary to drive comfortably. The farther back the backrests are tilted, the greater the risk of injury caused by incorrect positioning of the safety belts and improper seating position. • Never drive with the front seat passenger backrest tilted forward. If the front airbag deploys, the front backrest can be forced backward and injure passengers on the rear seat. • Sit as far back as possible from the steering wheel and the instrument panel. • Always sit upright with your back against the backrest with the front seats properly adjusted. Never lean against or place any part of your body too close to the area where the airbags are located. • Rear seat passengers who are not properly seated and restrained are more likely to be seriously injured in a crash. • Improper adjustment of the seats can cause accidents and severe injuries. • Never adjust the seats while the vehicle is moving. Your seat may move unexpectedly, and you could lose control of the vehicle. In addition, you will not be in the correct seating position while adjusting the seats. • Adjust the front seat height, angle and longitudinal direction only if the seat adjustment area is clear. • The adjustment of the front seats must not be restricted by things in the footwell in front or behind the seats. • Some kinds of cigarette lighters can be lit unintentionally or crushed, causing a fire that can result in serious burns and vehicle damage. • Always make sure that there are no lighters in the seat tracks or near other moving parts before adjusting the seats. • Before closing a storage compartment, always make sure that no cigarette lighter can be activated, crushed, or otherwise damaged. • Never leave a cigarette lighter in a storage compartment, on the instrument panel, or in other places in the vehicle. Heat buildup in the passenger and luggage compartment of a parked vehicle can result in temperatures in the vehicle that are much higher than the outside temperatures, particularly in summer. High temperatures could cause the cigarette lighter to catch fire. • Contact with parts of the vehicle interior can cause serious personal injury in a crash. • Always make sure that all vehicle occupants stay in a proper seating position and are properly restrained whenever the vehicle is moving. • Improper seating positions increase the risk of serious and fatal injury, especially when an airbag deploys and strikes a passenger in an improper seating position.

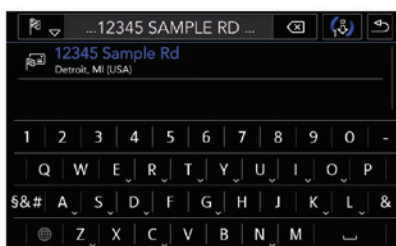

Enter a Destination on Your Touchscreen

1. Press the **NAV** button.
2. Press **New destn.** on the touchscreen.
3. Begin entering Point of Interest (POI) or address information, starting with House number, Street, City.
4. When your POI or address appears, touch the correct address on the screen.
5. Press **Start** to begin route calculation.

Note: When entering an address for another state, use only the two character abbreviation for the state.

To include alternative routes and make additional navigation customizations, select **Route options** prior to starting route guidance.

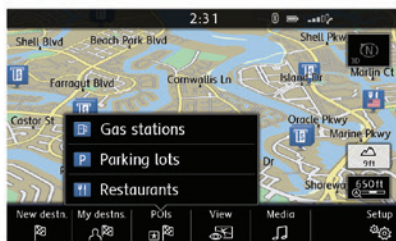
Cancel Active Route Guidance

1. Select **Route** on the touchscreen.
2. Select **Stop route guidance** option on the touchscreen.

Points of Interest

1. Press **NAV** button, then press POIs on the touchscreen to select the most common POI types for your travels.
2. Select **Start** to begin route guidance.

Note: The navigation SD card must be in one of the Media Box SD card slots.



One Shot Destination Entry

1. Press the **Talk** button on the multifunction steering wheel. A beep will sound.
2. Say, "New Destination".
3. After the beep, speak the address; for example "Two-Zero-Two-Four Main Street, Los Angeles". Speak single digits.
4. The system will repeat the address for confirmation and ask if you would like to start route guidance. After the beep, say "Yes" and guidance will begin.

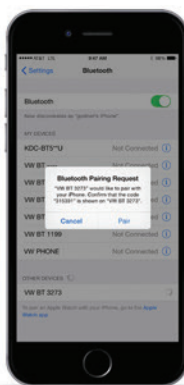

Pairing a Compatible Phone

1. First, check your phone's compatibility at www.knowyourvw.com/bluetooth.
2. Turn the ignition on. Your vehicle's Bluetooth system will be in "discovery" mode.
3. From the Bluetooth menu on your phone, search for new devices and select VW BT with the last four digits of your VIN.
4. A connection request will appear on the infotainment display.
5. Press **Connect** on the infotainment display.
6. The infotainment display will then show a PIN.
7. Make sure the same PIN is displayed on your phone and press **Yes** on the touchscreen, then press **Pair** on your phone.

Note: If your phone displays a prompt asking to connect to your vehicle, make sure to enable future automatic connections. This will help to automatically reconnect the compatible paired device to system. Once the PIN is shown, pairing must be completed within 30 seconds; otherwise the process will need to be repeated.



Primary and Secondary Phone Functionality

Two active phones can be connected simultaneously. Follow steps 1-7 above. Only contacts from the primary phone will be shown within the Infotainment system. Switching between phones requires pressing the swapping icon.

Note: This feature is not available when the phone is connected to Apple CarPlay and Android Auto.

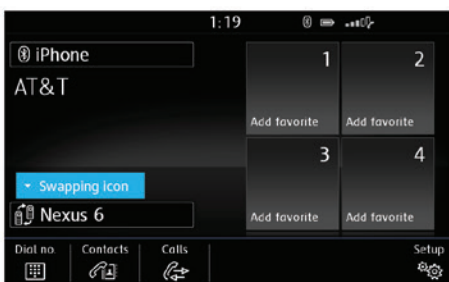

Switching from a Primary to a Secondary Phone

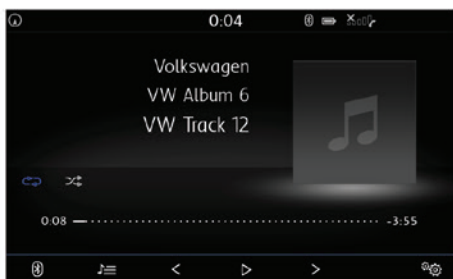
Both devices can receive incoming calls, however only the primary phone's contacts will be synced within the Infotainment system.

Press the swapping icon on the touchscreen.



Bluetooth® Audio Streaming

1. First, pair your compatible Bluetooth equipped phone or audio player. (Refer to Pairing a Compatible Phone steps 1-7 above.)
2. Press the **MEDIA** infotainment button.
3. Tap **Source** on the touchscreen and select **BT audio**.
4. To browse through your music, select **Play**, **Pause**, **Previous** or **Next** on the touchscreen.



Note: Browsing capability only available with an iPhone® Bluetooth connection.

Warnings: Bluetooth® Pairing

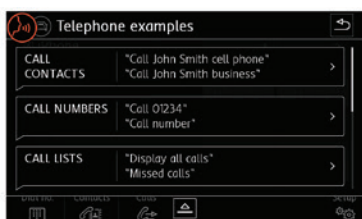
Talking on the phone and/or operating phone control while driving can distract from traffic and lead to accidents. • Always drive attentively and responsibly. • Select volume settings so that acoustic signals from the outside are audible, for example, the sirens of emergency/rescue vehicles. • In areas with no or poor mobile network coverage and possibly in tunnels, garages and subways, phone conversations may be interrupted, and it may be impossible to make phone calls – even emergency calls. • A cell phone on the seat, instrument panel or in other places can be thrown around the inside of the vehicle during a sudden braking maneuver, a crash or other accident and injure vehicle occupants. • Always fasten mobile phone, additional devices and phone accessories, such as phone holders, notepads, portable Infotainment systems properly and outside of the inflation area of the airbag or safely stow away during travel. • Using a cell phone or CB radio inside the vehicle without a properly installed and separate outside antenna can be dangerous to your health and that of your passengers because the electromagnetic radiation energy that cell phones and CB radios emit may be above established limits. 1. Short press the **TALK** button on the multifunction steering wheel.
2. After the chime say, "Call", followed by the name of the person you want to call. For example, "Call John Smith".
3. The system will confirm "Do you want to call John Smith?". You then reply "Yes", or if the contact has multiple numbers, select or say the desired line number on the screen when prompted. Once selected, the system will then say "Contact is being dialed".



Voice Recognition Tips

- The contact must be said exactly as it is stored in the directory.
- If multiple numbers are stored per contact, you may use the shortcut "Call John Smith work", or the system may ask you to choose, e.g., work, mobile, home, etc.

Answer an Incoming Call

The Bluetooth system will interrupt your car stereo with a ringtone. Press the **PHONE** button on the multifunction steering wheel or the green phone icon on the Infotainment screen to answer the call.

Volume Settings

To adjust the volume of the Bluetooth system while in a call, press the volume up or volume down switch on the left side of the multifunction steering wheel.

Switch to Private Mode

To switch a Bluetooth call to your mobile phone, which would prevent passengers from overhearing the conversation:

1. Once a call has been answered, use the right/left arrow menu buttons on the steering wheel to access the telephone menu in the instrument cluster display.
2. Press the up or down button until "Private" appears in the display.
3. To select, press the **OK** button on the multifunction steering wheel.



Help

1. From the Phone menu, press the **TALK** button on the multifunction steering wheel, and a selection of possible voice commands appears.
2. Say, "Help", then follow the prompts.

End a Call

Press the red phone icon on the touchscreen.

Or

1. Use the **MENU** button on the multifunction steering wheel to access the telephone menu in the instrument cluster display.
2. Press the up or down button until "End" appears in the display.
3. Press the **OK** button on the multifunction steering wheel.

Cancel Active Voice Recognition

Double press the **TALK** button  on the steering wheel.

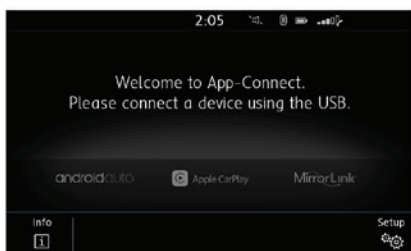

App-Connect

App-Connect takes the features and functions of your compatible smartphone and allows access to them through the built-in infotainment touchscreen in your Volkswagen.

Always pay careful attention to the road, and do not drive while distracted. Not all features available on all operating systems. Standard text and data usage rates apply. App-Connect features require compatible device, operating system and mobile apps. See mobile device and app providers for terms and privacy.



Apple CarPlay™

1. Ensure you are running the latest iOS on your device.
2. Plug your Apple iPhone into the USB port using a certified lightning cable.
3. A screen appears stating that a new device has been detected and asking, "Do you want to connect with Apple CarPlay?"
4. Select Allow to enable CarPlay® to access your iPhone while your phone is locked.

Note: When you are connected using Apple CarPlay, your iPhone can no longer be used as a source in MEDIA or as a Bluetooth device. Apple CarPlay is compatible with iPhone 5 or higher running iOS 7.1 or later. Further information can be found support.apple.com and siriuserguide.com.

Features

CarPlay features Siri® voice control. There are two ways to activate Siri (Siri must be enabled on device to activate Siri features):

- a. Press and hold the **TALK** button (voice control button) on the steering wheel until you hear the tone, which activates Siri.
- b. Press and hold the **Home** button on the touchscreen to activate Siri.

1. **Home Button:** Two features include:

- Returns to the main menu of the active app.
- Long press to activate Siri.

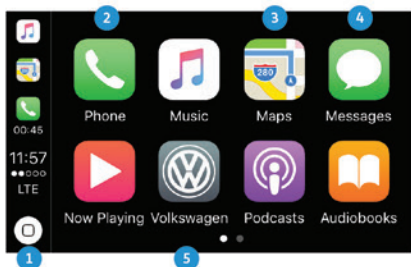
2. **Phone Button:** Siri can help you make calls, return missed calls and listen to voicemail.

3. **Maps Button:** Activate Siri to assist with turn-by-turn directions, traffic conditions and estimated travel time. Say "Navigate to."

4. **Messages Button:** Siri can send, read and reply to your text messages for you.

Additional apps available to stream music include Pandora, iHeartRadio, Spotify, and Apple Music.

5. To exit Apple CarPlay, press the Volkswagen logo icon to return to the Volkswagen Infotainment system. To disconnect from Apple CarPlay, press the **MENU** hard key > App-Connect on your touchscreen > select disconnect on the touchscreen.



Android Auto™

1. Ensure you are running the latest Android OS on your device and download Android Auto from the Google Play™ store. An active Google account and an internet connection is required.
2. Press the **MENU** hard key and select **App-Connect**.
3. Plug your Android device into the USB port using a certified cable.
4. Select **OK** on your touchscreen for data transfer prompt.
5. Select **Android Auto** on your touchscreen.
6. Follow instructions on your device to continue setup.
7. Android Auto will appear on the Infotainment touchscreen (once all the prompts have been accepted on device).

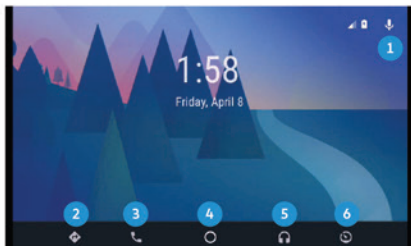

Features

1. **Microphone Button:** Talk to Google can be activated by a long press, or touchscreen voice commands work with available apps. (Talk to Google can also be activated with a long press on the **TALK** button on the steering wheel).
2. **Navigation Button:** Predictive navigation provides turn-by-turn directions, traffic conditions and estimated travel time. Android Auto can predict where you want to go next based on your calendar and recent destinations.
3. **Phone Button:** Listen and reply to text messages, make calls or check your voicemail.
4. **Home Screen Button:** Takes you back to the home screen of Android Auto.
5. **Music and Audio Button:** Use your touchscreen to gain access to your favorite artists, songs and playlists*. Android Auto lets you stream from apps such as Pandora, Spotify and iHeartRadio.
6. **Vehicle Functions Button:** Return to Volkswagen Infotainment system. To deactivate, press **MENU** hard key > App-Connect on your touchscreen > select disconnect on the touchscreen.



*For driver distraction reasons Android Auto does not list all the media on your phone. Use Google voice control instead to access specific albums or artists.
